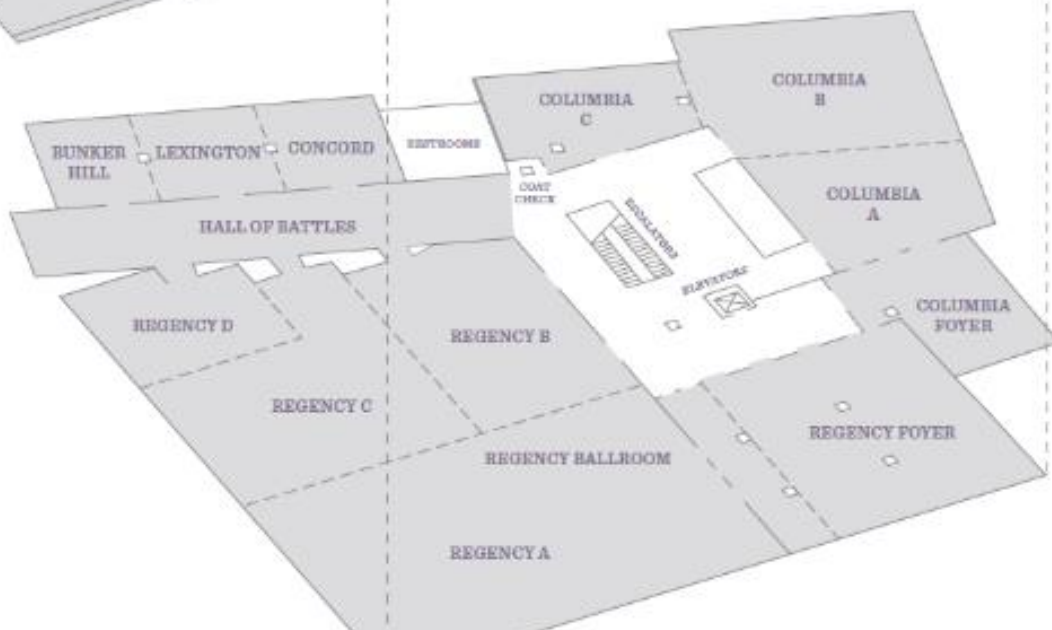


Hyatt Regency Washington on Capitol Hill
